



The Gospel According to Saint Luke

A reading plan for Eastertide in the Jubilee Year 2025





Thank you for responding to the invitation and challenge to read the whole of the Gospel according to Saint Luke between Easter and Pentecost. On numerous occasions throughout his pontificate Pope Francis has asked, 'Have you read part of the gospel to-day?' or 'Do you carry a gospel with you to be able to read some verses each day?'

The Holy Father commends reading part of the Gospel every day so that we can listen to Jesus at all times. In this Jubilee Year '*Pilgrims of Hope*' I invite you to join me in reading S.Luke's Gospel this Eastertide, just a few verses each day. If you are able to share that reading aloud with your family all the better, perhaps taking turns with the pericopes for the day. In calling the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis wrote, *During the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind ... following the life and example of Jesus who at the beginning of his ministry, presenting himself as the fulfilment of the "year of the Lord's favour" (cf. Lk 4:18-19). (cf. Spes Non Confundit. 10)*

In his Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel) the Holy Father says the Lord does not disappoint those who take the risk of letting Him encounter them each day; '*no one is excluded from the joy brought by the Lord*'. (3)

I invite you now, in prayer, to discover again the gift of Christ through these sacred words. Allow yourself to be challenged and persuaded. Permit yourself to be refreshed and surprised. My prayer for you is that in reading Luke's account, you will once again discover the joy of the gospel, and with your heart burning within you and renewed in faith – your life will proclaim the Lord's favour aloud in the world around you as a gift to all those whom you encounter.

'Mary, Virgin and Mother, ... obtain for us a new ardour born of the resurrection, that we may bring to all the Gospel of life which triumphs over death.' (EG.288)

Saint Luke's Gospel

This account of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and his teaching represents the heart of the Christian story – an account that describes the gift of new life, offered to each one of us. Through the lens of Luke, a Gentile Christian writing for Gentile Christians around the year 70 we gain a unique perspective on Jesus and his passion for social justice and the plight of the poor. We discover six miracles and 18 parables not found in the other gospels; and a special connection with the women in Jesus' life, especially Mary in his description of the Annunciation, Visitation and Magnificat. It is in Luke's gospel that we find an emphasis on mercy and forgiveness most famously in the stories of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son. This all reflects a universalism not found in the other Gospels. The importance of hospitality and journeys are two more themes running throughout, reaching their climax with the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus (24:13ff), when their 'hearts burned within them' with the vitality of the Good News. Luke projects on the events of the life of Jesus the light of the mystery of the Passion-Resurrection. He views the life, death and resurrection of Jesus as a complete unit; and he alone of the evangelists relates the Ascension of Jesus.

The words of this gospel echo throughout the centuries precisely because the God who speaks, continues to invite us to be transformed, and gradually conformed to the likeness of the One who was the gift to others. Not dead words on a page, but a living message addressed to each of us personally.

JUBILEE LOGO

The Logo shows four stylized figures to indicate all of humanity from the four corners of the earth. They are each embracing another, indicating the solidarity and brotherhood that must unite peoples. It should be noted that the first figure is clinging to the cross. The underlying waves are choppy to indicate that the pilgrimage of life is not always on calm waters. Oftentimes personal circumstances and world events call for a greater sense of hope. This is why the lower part of the Cross is elongated turning into an anchor, which dominates the movement of the waves. As is well known, the anchor has often been used as a metaphor for hope. In fact, in maritime jargon, the hope anchor is the name given to the spare anchor, used by vessels for emergency manoeuvres to stabilize the ship during storms. It should be noted that the image shows how the pilgrim's journey is not individual, but rather communal, with the signs of a growing dynamism that moves more and more toward the Cross. The Cross is by no means static, but it, too, is dynamic, bending toward and meeting humanity as if not to leave it alone, but rather offering the certainty of its presence and the reassurance of hope. Finally, the Jubilee 2025 Motto, *Peregrinantes in Spem* is clearly visible in the colour green.
