30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

The episode of the healing of Bartimaeus that we have read in the Gospel has a lot to teach about the light that the Christian receives when meeting Christ in Baptism. It is in this sacrament that the eyes of men and women are opened. That is where they understand what it means to follow Christ. The first reading prepares this teaching as it describes the journey of the "blind" people of Israel from slavery to freedom. God himself is their guide. The blind Bartimaeus is the symbol of our journey to God. Like Bartimaeus, often we too are blind. We do not see the evil that we commit; we do not perceive the need of others; at times we close our eyes to the injustices and oppressions that surround us; at other time, we do not recognize Jesus who passes by us. The physical blindness arrests free movement of a person. The spiritual blindness blocks our relationship with God and with one another. Today, Jesus invites us to overcome our spiritual blindness following certain steps as suggested in the Gospel. First of all, we must recognize our inability to overcome our blindness on our own. Secondly, we must rely upon the power of God who only can change us and lead us to salvation. Thirdly, we must overcome the obstacles on our way to encounter Jesus as Bartimaeus did. Finally, we must give expression to our intense desire and hope in prayer and cry out with Bartimaeus: "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me."

This retreat explores the life and faith of St Dominic de Guzman, founder of the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans), whose objective was to continue safeguarding the Catholic faith.
