For collaboration between different religious traditions. Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice and human fraternity.

30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: , YEAR C:

The Gospel of today will not be easily understood unless we keep in mind what the first reading teaches us about God's justice. God is just, says Ben Sira, not because he grants each person what the person deserves, but because he saves the poor and listens to the cries of the miserable and defenceless. The Gospel tells us that this is God's attitude. He is moved by the publican who can present only his misery and his sins. Jesus through the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector praying in the temple, teaches us to have right attitude in prayer. The Pharisee in the parable presented before God an account of how good he was. He compared his life with the life of the tax collector and misunderstood this as prayer. Anyone who despises his fellow being cannot pray. Prayer is an experience of being in the presence of the Lord and listening to God in the silence of one's heart and offering oneself to God. The Tax collector compared his life with the holiness of God and acknowledged his sinfulness and besought mercy. Hence, we must not place ourselves where we do not belong, and place others where we feel they should be. Rather, we must humbly acknowledge our nothingness, vulnerability and weakness before God, the just Judge. "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

October - Month of the Rosary

Do pray the Rosary (Mary's special prayer) ideally every day - but, at least, as often as possible - a great source of strength.

"The Rosary is a prayer both so humble and simple and a theologically rich in Biblical content. I beg you to pray it." *St John Paul II*

The Solemnity of “All Saints”

Usually celebrated on November 1st, is transferred this year to Sunday November 2nd, as happens nowadays when a Holiday of Obligation falls on a Saturday or a Monday. On this Feast we honour the great army of saints who rejoice in the wonderful vision and presence of God in Heaven and whose company we ourselves hope to join one day. We do this by celebrating Mass together on this holy day.

Monday 3rd November – Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (“All Souls” Day) – usually on November 2nd

On this day we remember our dear dead (especially those who may be suffering the purification of Purgatory) with special attention and love. A Plenary Indulgence may be gained for those holy souls on one of the days from 1st to 8th November by visiting devoutly a cemetery and praying there for the dead, or by visiting a church on All Souls Day, 3rd November, and praying there the Our Father and the Creed.

Remembering Our Faithful Departed in November

You are warmly invited to have your departed loved ones remembered in a special way during all Parish Masses throughout November, beginning on the 3rd. To do so, please write their names on one of the lists available in the church porch (or on your own paper), place the list in an envelope (either your own or one provided in the porch), and place it in the basket on the Altar. **Please do not include any money.**

These envelopes will remain on the Altar throughout November, and the names will be prayerfully remembered at each Mass.

Most importantly, we encourage you to attend as many of these Masses as possible and join in prayer for our beloved dead.

CONFIRMATION

The Confirmation preparation is open to children/young adults of families within the Cathedral Parish and close by Parishes. Children/young adults wishing to participate in the preparation **must** ask their parents/guardian to register following this link
