For the prevention of suicide. Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C:

Your perseverance will win you your lives.

Today we celebrate the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary time Year C and we are reminded that God is always at work, even when times are hard. The readings speak of judgement, warning and also hope. They call us to stay faithful and trust that God will care for those who honour Him. In the first reading, Malachi tells a fierce day that will burn away the wicked, but for those who fear the Lord, healing will come like the sunrising. Psalm 98 invites us to sing with joy because God rules with justice and fairness. His rule brings hope to all who long for peace. Paul in the second reading urges the Thessalonians to live responsibly and work hard. Faith is not lazy, It shows in daily actions. Jesus in the Gospel warns of destruction, war, and persecution but also promises wisdom and strength. The readings this Sunday encourage us to remain faithful and diligent in our work and faith. They remind us that despite the trials we face, God's justice and healing will prevail. Though the readings speak of "the end of the world," the world they mean is "the world of sin, of suffering, of injustice, of hatred..." This is the world that will be wiped out, demolished, says God and its place will be taken by a completely new reality where only good will exist. We are reminded not to place our ultimate trust in worldly things but in God. Reorienting our lives to God will bring internal and external struggles. True followers of Christ should expect opposition when they prioritize God over worldly values.
