The Pope's Intention:

For the prevention of suicide. Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.

THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING, YEAR C:

The first reading tells us how David, after defeating all his enemies, was anointed king over all Israel. His kingdom, great and powerful, became the symbol of the kingdom of peace and justice that God would one day establish on earth. Israel waited many centuries for the coming of the one who would begin this kingdom. The Gospel gives us God's answer to the expectations. Jesus was not proclaimed king as he sat on a throne, but when he was nailed to a cross. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the final Sunday of the liturgical year. This feast is not about earthly power, crowns of gold, or armies, but about a kingship rooted in love, service, and sacrifice. The Gospel reding takes us to Calvery. Here, Jesus reigns not from a throne of marble, but from the cross. His crown is made of thorns, His sceptre is a nail-pierced hand, and His royal decree is mercy.: "Today you will be with me in paradise." This scene reveals a profound truth – that, Christ's kingship is unlike any other. Earthly rulers often seek to be served; Christ came to serve. Worldly kings defend their power; Christ gives His life for His people. His authority is not imposed by force but offered as an invitation to trust, follow, and to be transformed. The repentant thief shows us the way: he recognizes Jesus as King even in apparent defeat, and he entrusts himself to him. The act of faith opens the door to eternal life. As we close the Church's year, this feast challenges us to ask: 1. Is Christ truly in my life - in my decisions, my relationships, my priorities? 2. Do I follow Him only when it is easy, or also when the path leads to the cross? May we, like the good thief, turn to Him and say: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And may we hear His promise: "Today you will be with me in paradise."

- Second reading: Romans 13:11-14a

- Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

Assisted Suicide in Wales

Members of the Senedd, the Welsh Parliament, will be asked to decide whether Wales should give its consent to Westminster's Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill — a law that would legalise assisted suicide. This would be a profound change for Wales and would mean that, for the first time, doctors could be asked to assist a patient in ending their life intentionally.

If enacted, this bill would put the most vulnerable in our society at risk of coercion. The conscientious objection clause for doctors is inadequate. Furthermore, parliament has explicitly rejected an amendment whereby care homes and hospices could opt out of facilitating assisted suicide on their premises and yet many care homes and hospices will want no involvement. Even with stricter rules, experience from other countries shows that once assisted suicide is introduced, the safeguards soon loosen and those who are elderly, disabled, or feel they are a burden begin to feel subtle pressure to choose death.
