## The Pope's Intention:

**That everyone might have food.** Let us pray that everyone, from large producers to small consumers, be committed to avoid wasting food, and to ensure that everyone has access to quality food.

### FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR -A

Mobility is a major concern in modern living. People are constantly on the move. Newer and faster means of transportation are available to the people of today. Our spiritual life too is a journey. The essential condition for a person setting on a journey is that they should have clear understanding of their destination and should choose appropriate means to arrive at the destination safe and sound. In spiritual journey too, we should know the destination and we should choose the correct means to arrive at this. Today's Gospel offers a challenge in this regard. It deals with both our destination and the means to arrive at it. Believers in Christ need not despair for in Christ we have both the means and the destination. Fully aware of his enemies' determination to destroy him, Jesus'



concern is not for himself but for them. sensing their sadness and apprehension, he prepares them for his imminent departure with words of comfort and encouragement. He urges them to trust in God and also in him, assuring them that *'there are many rooms in my Father's house;'* that he is going *'to prepare a place'* for them, and that he will return to take them with him. These are not empty words meant to soothe temporarily. They are a lifeline – a call to anchor our hearts in the unshakable reality of God's presence and faithfulness. And they are spoken not only to the disciples more than two thousand years ago, but to each of us today - especially when we face our own moments of fear, loss, or confusion. In this regard, Jesus declares; *"I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me."*

This week, when anxiety or doubt creeps in, pause and pray:

“Lord, You are my **Way**, my **Truth**, and my **Life**. Lead me home to You.”
