THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY, YEAR A

Today, we stand before the greatest and most beautiful mystery of our faith: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity just a week after Pentecost: We celebrate one God in three Persons – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – a communion of perfect love. Today's celebration is a song of praise to God, who has called us to share in this mystery. Two concise prayers and blessings include: "May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and fellowship of the



Holy Spirit be with you," and "May the Almighty God bless you the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." These are called trinitarian formulas. In these, the Trinitarian God unites to perform the function for which they are being consulted. We celebrate the greatest mystery of our faith which we would not know anything about if God had not revealed it to us. The mystery is this: that God is Father, Son, and Spirit. The Trinity Sunday invites us to reflect on "Three Persons and One God." The Trinity is not a problem to be solved but a mystery to be lived. Though we cannot fully understand God, He reveals Himself to us through Jesus Christ. Augustine of Hippo reminds us that if we think we fully understand God, then what we understand is not God. Therefore, the Trinity invites us not only to study God but also to adore Him. In the readings for this

Sunday – especially in the Gospel words of John 3:16 – God reveals that the Trinity is not an abstract concept; it is an outpouring of pure love. God did not create us out of loneliness, but out of an abundance of communion. Today, we are invited not just to understand the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, but to step inside their eternal circle of love and allow it to transform how we love one another. Hence, the theme of today's feast is "Called to live in Divine Love."

If you cannot join in person, please consider uniting with the pilgrims in prayer.

Debbie is helping to gather items to support the hospital in Kharkiv and frontline troops. If you have anything that you don't use anymore or know someone who can help, contact Debbie Evans. People may have **painkillers, antibacterial drugs and antibiotics, sealed medication (not expired), sterile dressings, Wrist/Knee Support catheters (urine and blood), absorbent bed pads, incontinence pads/adult diapers in their cupboards they are not using any more. Walking frames, crutches, wheelchairs, foot fracture boots that cannot be returned to hospital and may be in the attic, taking up space. Items such as foot and hand warmers, yoga mats and sleeping bags, wipes, soap, Insect repellents, adhesive tape, shaving razors, toothbrushes, moisturising cream and lipsticks, dark chocolate, tea, coffee, cocoa (not in glass jars), protein-rich drinks and food** are also required.
