## The Pope's Intention:

**For the value of sports.** Let us pray that sports be an instrument of peace, encounter, and dialogue among cultures and nations, and that they promote values such as respect, solidarity, and personal growth.

### ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR A

The eleventh Sunday in ordinary time reminds us that God loves His people and acts first. He chooses Israel, saves them, and asks them to trust Him. Paul tells us that Jesus gave His life for us while we were still sinners. In the Gospel, Jesus feels compassion for the crowds and sends His disciples to help others. This Sunday shows that we are chosen and sent. God gives freely, and He asks us to share that love with others through service and care. Hence, the readings this Sunday remind us of God's love and His call to be His people. They show us a journey. God chooses Israel as His treasured possession. In the Gospel Jesus sends His disciples to share His compassion with the world. And so, this Sunday teaches that God acts first. He saves, forgives, and heals. Our part is to respond with trust and love. The covenant at Sinai, the sacrifice of Christ, and the mission of the disciples all show how God draws His people close. This Sunday invites us to our role in God's plan. We are chosen, loved, and sent out to serve. God calls us to share freely the gifts we have received. This is the work of His people in every time and place. The Lord is still looking at the crowds today – in our towns, our workplaces, our families – and His heart is still moved with compassion.

The question is: *will we be among the labourers he sends into the harvest?*
