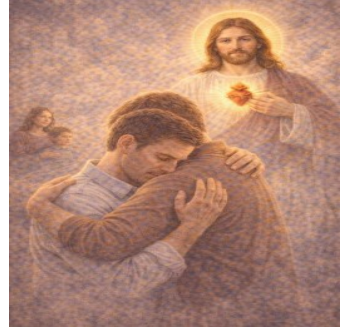
The Pope's Intention:

For the care of water. Let us pray for a just and sustainable management of water, a vital resource, so that everyone may have equal access to it.

This Sunday is **EDUCATION SUNDAY** when we offer our prayers for students and teachers and all staff.

24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A Lord, how often will my brother sin

against me, and I forgive him? This Sunday's readings focus on forgiveness, reminding us that there is no limit to God's mercy and unconditional love. We cannot repay God's forgiveness, but we can follow God's free, unearned mercy by our forgiving others with patience and compassion. The reading from Sirach warns against anger, telling us to not keep a record of grudges because letting go of anger will restore peace to ourselves. Instead, we are to live by the commandments, overlooking errors and forgiving our neighbour. The Psalm also praises the depth of the Lord's compassion and mercy, telling of God's care



for us. There is no end to his forgiveness nor love. St Paul in his letter to the Romans explains that we belong to the Lord both in life and death. Christ died and rose because of his great love for us. We are also called to live not for ourselves alone but also for others, showing love and mercy. In the extract from Matthew's Gospel, we hear how Jesus teaches about forgiveness through the parable of a servant forgiven a large debt by a merciful king; but the servant then refuses to forgive a much smaller debt. Jesus warns that people should not expect mercy from God if they do not show mercy to others. We are called always to forgive others wholeheartedly. This week, we pray for one another and ask for the grace to forgive, welcoming the healing and reconciliation forgiveness brings. We

remember too those who are unable to forgive, and all who are affected by war, violence and unrest throughout the world.

First Holy Communion and Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Cathedral First Holy Communion programme is Parish based and Open to children in school year 3 or above who are Baptised Catholics.
